

Interval Lines: 2nds & 3rds


An Interval Line is an incomplete staff. It has just 2 or 3 staff lines, so it is easier to focus on the interval rather than thinking about the note names. The interval line below has 2 staff lines and 8 notes.



Studying this Interval Line carefully, we see there are 2nds, 3rds and repeated notes:




Now the first note of this Interval Line has a name and a finger number. Using your Right Hand, play through the intervals of this Interval Line on your piano beginning with finger 2 on an F key.




Which note did you end on? If it was a G (with finger 3), you did a great job! If not, try again.


Interval Line Studies
